PROGRAM NOTE

This piece is a musical representation of the kallikantzaroi, found in Greek folklore, thought to dwell underground in groups, like trolls (*In the Hall of the Mountain King*), but who come to the surface from December 25 to January 6 (*The Twelve Days of Christmas* and Winter from *Vivaldi's Four Seasons*)

It is believed that kallikantzaroi stay underground, sawing the trunk of the tree that holds the Earth (*Oh Christmas Tree*) so that it will collapse, taking the Earth with it. When the final part of the trunk is about to be sawed, Christmas dawns (*Sing We Now of Christmas*), and the kallikantzaroi can come to the surface. Finally, they must return underground on the Epiphany (*We Three Kings*) to continue their sawing. However, during their absence, the world tree has healed itself (*A Partridge in a Pear Tree*), so they must start working again.

The most common belief is that kallikantzaroi are small, like elves. Some Greek illustrators imagined them having some animal parts, such as donkeys' ears and monkeys' arms, hairy bodies, and long tails. The composer adds snippets of *Sweetly Sings the Donkey* and *Monkey See, Monkey Do* disguised in a minor mode as a musical inside joke.

People sought to protect themselves in several ways during the days when the kallikantzaroi were loose. One such method is to leave a colander on their doorstep to trick the visiting kallikantzaroi. It was believed that because they could not count past 3, (3 verses of 12 Days of Christmas), the kallikantzaroi would sit at the doorstep all night, recounting each hole of the colander until the sun rose and it was forced to hide. Another purported method to keep them away was to burn the Yule log for twelve days. In other regions, people would throw foul-smelling shoes into the fire, as the stench was believed to repel the kallikantzaros.

The unique qualities that set the Kallikantzaroi apart from other goblins or creatures in folklore were the brief duration of their stay on Earth and the fact that they were not considered evil creatures, just impish and simpleminded.

NOTES TO CONDUCTOR

Attention to all articulation markings will help provide clarity of rhythm and style.

Awareness of balance is especially critical between measures 35 and 45 when various tunes are played simultaneously so the audience can recognize the musical inside jokes.

Strive for a wide dynamic spectrum to enhance the drama behind this humorous folktale. Take care to not play the pizzicato passages too delicately to create the desired resonance.
