## **Program Notes**

This exciting piece for young orchestra is sure to entertain both audience and performer alike! Cherokee Legend takes young musicians to a place and time where they encounter a tribal melody once sung by a proud, brave Native American chief. The main melody and counter melody are shared by all the sections throughout the duration of the piece. Adding the optional floor tom can help maintain a steady temporthroughout the piece as well as enhance its overall character. It is important to make sure each staccato note is observed to achieve the intended style. Drive the ensemble through the legato sections as they may slow down. Notes that are not marked staccato should be played with long, legato bow strokes. Throughout the piece, the violins should "sing" like a mighty warrior chief.
